Minutes of the PRSCO Council Meeting

b) Minutes of the PRSCO Council Meeting in Denver, Thursday 11th November 2010

PRSCO Council Meeting minutes were reviewed and T John Kim moved to adopt them. Madden, the Minutes of the Thursday 11 Meeting was approved.

c) The venue of the 12th PRSCO Summer Institute, 2012

There are two offers to host the 2012 Summer Institute: china and Ecuador. Yuyuan Wen of Renmin University of China, Beijing presented the China proposal. Juan Garcia presented the Ecuador proposal.

Kingsley moves to have China 2012 and Ecuador in 2014. Higano suggested that the regional science is of growing importance in China and Beijing is more suitable as the venue in 2012. Madden noted that proposals for China 2012 and Ecuador in 2014 were accepted.

d) The venue for the 23rd PRSCO Regular Meeting, 2013

There are two offers to host the 2013 PRSCO meeting: Chile and Indonesia. Patricio Aroca presented the proposal from Chile. They have experience organizing both domestic and international meetings. The meeting would be co-hosted with RSAMericaas. Budy Resosudarmo presented the proposal from Indonesia. They have a large section and support/interest on the part of the government. Both proposals were considered very good.

John Madden noted that both proposals are very good and we could settle both 2013 and 2015. Since both countries prefer to host in 2013, Dr. Higano suggested a sub-committee be organized to further discuss the 2013 venue. Sub-committee of Shibusawa, Madden, and Yang will gather more materials for the Miami council meeting.

e) Establishment of the PRSCO Awards

PRSCO is alone in the super regions in not having an established set of awards. Kingsley suggested looking at what NARSC and ERSA have as a point of comparison. Madden wondered how any prize(s) will be funded. It was decided that Madden and Shibusawa will gather information and Haynes asked that they put a proposal forward based on the information collected.

f) Report on activities of Pacific Rim regional science communities

Dr. Higano noted that there will be three big regional science meetings in China next year. On the subject of how to give incentive to young regional science scholars in China, Dr. Higano proposed a special issue of *Papers in Regional Science* from papers from those meetings. Dr. Madden suggested that there be a special issue also of *Regional Science Policy & Practice*.

Malaysia. There will be a conference in early December on regional development(?) in Kuala Lumpur. Madden noted that it would be best if the meeting didn't clash with ANZ meeting 6-9 December.

The Western Regional Science Association will host its 51st annual meeting in early February 2012 in Kauai, Hawaii. The WRSA also recently moved its offices from the University of Arizona to Brown University in Rhode Island and Rachel Franklin has taken over from David Plane as Executive Director of the WRSA.

g) Report of Editors, Papers in Regional Science Policy and Practice (M. Carroll) Michael Carroll provided an update on *Regional Science Policy & Practice*. Wiley has increased the number of institutional subscribers. RS P&P has gone from 2 to 4 issues a year. A special issue from Peter Nijkamp is forthcoming. Other special issue(s) will come from John Carruthers. Paper downloads have increased and so have submissions. In 2008 there were 4 submissions; in 2010 there were 24; and in the first 6 months of 2011 there were 35 unsolicited submissions.

PRSCO Delegate for RSAI Council – Haynes moved that Higano and Aroca's terms be extended for another two years. T. John Kim seconded the motion, which passed.
